Deb Dempsey and Colleen Riggan from Thames Valley Children’s Centre School Support Program brought their expertise in the area of Autism Spectrum Disorders to discuss Universal Supports

in the classroom. Joan Waringer, Mary Hickey, and Jennifer Benedetti from the London District Catholic School Board discussed a school support model that brings resource and classroom teachers together to provide common strategies throughout the school.
