Program Design

This program is designed to support and challenge educators who are engaged in leading curriculum in an era of rapid technological, demographic, cultural, and linguistic change. Graduates will have explored and developed knowledge as well as the ability to apply that knowledge in curricular practice relative to a breadth of curricular and pedagogical issues.

Course topics include:

- · contemporary and historical conceptions of curriculum
- · curriculum models
- · analyzing, designing, implementing, and evaluating curriculum at all levels
- · development of reflective curricular practice
- · implications of curriculum for equity and social justice
- · curricular commonplaces (i.e. the teacher, the learner, the subject matter, and the milieu)

Admission Requirements

Normally, a 4 year degree (20 full courses or equivalent) from an accredited university is required. Applicants with 3 year degrees will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Applicants must have a minimum "B" standing (70%) or equivalent in the final two years of study.
